A program in Brantford has been bringing children's laughter to a long-term care homes and hospices for almost two decades. St. Joseph's Lifecare Centre and St. Jospeh's YMCA Child Care Centre are just steps away from each other on Wayne Gretzky Parkway. Seniors and children meet up, share stories and play together.

"After the children visit, the seniors always have a brighter smile on their face," Steve Linesman, a recreational therapist with St. Joseph's, said. "You just have a little more energy. It just lights up their eyes and it really makes their day."

The children have given the seniors an affectionate nickname: GrandPals.

## St. Joseph's Lifecare Centre to Launch Living Classroom in 2025



The Living Classroom is a cutting-edge approach of integrating education into

a long-term care or retirement home to support workforce development in senior living.

PSW students, faculty, and those living, visiting, and working in the home will engage in a culture of shared learning.

SJLCB will be accommodating up to 19 students enrolled at GELA (Grand Erie Learning Alternatives), a school within the Grand Erie District School Board. Rooms on the main level and in the basement of St. Joseph's Lifecare Centre are being renovated to become a speciallyequipped classroom and simulation laboratory to be used by staff and students. The students will be paired with preceptors on the units as part of their hands-on training.

This program will help fill a vital need for healthcare workers in the local community, including SJLCB.

#### **Council Achievements in 2024**

- 1. Requested and provided the Infection Prevention Control report to share with families at Family Council monthly meeting.
- 2. Conducted a Family Survey to receive feedback, input, and suggestions for Family Council's role and for events.
- 3. Funded and supported the 8 Palliative Carts/Supplies carts holding comfort items for end-of-life residents and their families.
- 4. Initiated, hosts, and funds the Friends and Resident/ Family Social Event once a month on Sunday afternoons. Watch for the dates.
- 5. Initiated, created and updates a "Did You Know" Booklet. Facilitates the "Did you Know Hour" session every 5-6 weeks to orient new families to the amenities, programs and services.
- 6. Streamlined and improved the "Welcome and Orientation" process for new family admittance.
- 7. Implemented the Family Council Resident Assistance Fund to support residents who don't have financial resources for needed items.
- 8. Continued to host fundraising events such as the Annual Vintage Car Show and Holiday Bazaar.
- 9. Actively recruited volunteers and Welcome ambassadors. (Their role is to welcome the resident and family member, provide information on Family Council and orientation materials.)
- 10. Continued to fund the "Friday Music Program" once a month.
- 11. Continued to invite guest speakers to meetings to create awareness and provide education on topics of interest.
