Roofing & HVAC Improvement Projects now complete

am pleased to share that two major facility projects at St. Joseph's Lifecare Centre Brantford have now been completed.

The replacement of three RTAC (rooftop air conditioning/heating units) and the replacement of the roof itself at all areas of the facility were completed during late June and early July.

RTAC 1, 4 and 7 were replaced. RTAC 1 and RTAC 4 service the loop at the north and south end of the resident floor area from the ground floor through to the third level. RTAC 7 services the core area of the facility, the space by the elevators and areas immediately to the east. Replacement of these RTAC units will provide our residents with years of comfortable and reliable air quality and temperature.

The replacement of the roof presented some logistical challenges with traffic restrictions, entry modifications and general inconveniences. With the roof now replaced, we all can look forward to decades of assurance that we are all securely sheltered.

My sincerest thanks to residents and their families for your patience and understanding through the various project challenges and related inconveniences over the past two years. We couldn't have gotten through this without your support.

I would be remiss if I did not take this opportunity to extend a huge thank you to St. Joseph's Lifecare Foundation for providing the \$2.2 million in funding that was required for a new roof.

Additionally, it is important to recognize the grants received from the federal and provincial governments to make upgrades to our HVAC system, totalling approximately \$1 million.

We are in the preliminary stages of laying the groundwork for the window replacements in resident rooms. I look forward to sharing more exciting news as projects develop and unfold.
