Re: Stage 2 of Reopening

Beginning Wednesday, July 7, 2021, as part of the province's Stage Two of reopening the following changes will take place at St. Joseph's Long-Term Care Home:

- Residents can now have up to two Essential Caregivers and two General Visitors present during an indoor visit.
- Residents can now have up to 10 people participate in an outdoor visit.
- Residents may have additional designated Essential Caregivers. Please contact one of the team members listed below if you wish to become an Essential Caregiver.
- Outdoor visits no longer need to be scheduled in advanced. All visitors, indoor and outdoor must continue to be screened

To continue to protect residents, visitors and staff against transmission, the following COVID-19 rules apply:

Indoors and Outdoors

All visitors, Essential Caregivers and General Visitors alike, regardless of immunization status, are required to screen in and wear a mask.

Indoors

All General Visitors are required to complete a Rapid Antigen test following screening and remain in the screening area for 15 minutes to receive a negative test result prior to visiting a resident area.

When in a resident area, General Visitors who are not fully immunized must observe physical distancing of two metres. Brief hugs are permitted. Essential caregivers who are not fully immunized are required to observe physical distancing of two metres, except when providing direct care. When providing direct care eye protection is required. Brief hugs are permitted.

If it is determined that people are removing their masks when outside, Rapid Antigen Testing will become necessary for General Visitors who are visiting outdoors, requiring them to remain inside for 15 minutes to await a negative test result before proceeding outside.
